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Title V/CSHCN

The Maternal and Child Health Services Block Grant, Title V, is a federal program that improves the health of all mothers, children, and families. Each state/territory has a Title V program that serves children with special health care needs (CSHCN) ages birth to 21. These programs help to remove barriers and link children with special health care needs with community resources including family support, care coordination, waiver services, specialty clinics, and financial assistance. Services vary by location. Participants with special healthcare needs must meet medical and financial eligibility. To locate a CSHCN program, visit www.kidswaivers.org.
